Our April Recipe of the Month is Crock Pot Pork Chops

Pork Chops

Can of French Onion Soup

Ranch powder dressing mix

Brown gravy mix

Put all ingredients in crock pot on High. When it comes to a boil turn down to low. It will cook in about 4 - 5 hours. If you want it to cook all day, then put the crock pot on Low and it will take approximately 7 - 8 hours.

Serve with rice or mashed potatoes.

You may want to double the gravy recipe depending on the number of pork chops you use.

Using chemical products to keep mosquitoes away is not always on the top of everyone's list and some can be harmful if used in the wrong way or around some animals or small children.

Citronella is a beautiful perennial grass that emits a strong aroma. That aroma masks other scents and keeps mosquitoes from being attracted to other things located around it. It is a great choice as it is easy to grow and can get very tall. You can grow it in pots and place it around a porch or patio or plant it directly in the yard or garden.

Lemon Balm is a member of the mint family and is an easy plant for beginning gardeners, even if you don't have a green thumb. It is hardy, resists drought and grows well, even in shade. It is fast growing and sometimes aggressive so you may want to contain it to a pot so you can move it and it won't take over your garden. You can also dry the leaves and use them for a delicious herbal tea!

Catnip is also a great mosquito deterrent. In a 2010 study, it was found that catnip is 10 times more effective than Deet, which is found in many bug repellents. Cat love it though so be careful not to plant it in other areas where cats may roll around in it and ruin your other plants!

A few others are Marigold, Basil, Lavendar, Peppermint, Garlic, Rosemary, Pennyroyal, Geraniums. Go to the link and read all about them!

YOTM Guidelines:

- Foundation — placement of shrubbery.
- Plants and shrubs at the end of the walkway or beside the front door should be kept trimmed so that they do not obstruct the view of the front door. The front door should be the focal point, as a sign of welcome to the house.
 - * Taller shrubbery usually looks better on the corners of the house with lower ones under windows & Shrubbery in front of the windows should be kept trimmed below the level of the window.
- Consistency of design — the plan of border and edging of small plants and bulbs should be in harmony with foundation plantings.
- General Landscaping — foundation and design consistency combined. Pine straw should not be raked up around trees unless there are flowers or shrubs around the tree.
- Improvements
- Condition of Shrubbery
- Lawn
- Color
- Only the front yard is judged. The yard is judged from the roadway, directly in front of the doorway. The homeowner must be current with association dues!
