Carmalized Baked Chicken Recipe

2 1/2 lbs Chicken Breasts (or whichever part you prefer)
3/4 cup honey
1/2 cup soy sauce
1/4 cup ketchup
2-3 cloves garlic, minced
Salt and pepper or Tony Chachere's (or any other of your favorites)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350° F. Season the chicken with Salt & Pepper or your choice of seasoning. Put the chicken in a pyrex dish

You can use foil to line any dish if you prefer (the foil is ONLY to make clean up easier)

In a glass container, mix the honey, soy sauce, ketchup, and minced garlic and stir.

If the mixture doesn't combine well, microwave on high for thirty seconds and stir again.

Pour the mixture over the chicken.

Put the chicken in the oven and bake for 45 minutes.

Take the chicken out of the oven and flip it so that the bottom that was in the sauce is now on the top out of the sauce. Put it back in the oven.

Raise the heat to 425° F and bake until the sauce is bubbly and starts to caramelize on the chicken legs. This should take about 15 minutes.

Remove the chicken from the oven and allow it to rest for 5 minutes before serving.

SPECIAL NOTE:

Remember that school is back in session so be extra careful in the mornings and afternoons while the buses are picking up and dropping off the kids. The yard has a good balance of plants, beautiful containers, nice large ferns on the porch, and the front door is a nice focal point. Their front door entrance definitely says "welcome"!

Yard of The Month Guidelines

- A. Foundation — placement of shrubbery.
- B. Plants and shrubs at the end of the walkway or beside the front door should be kept trimmed so that they do not obstruct the view of the front door. The front door should be the focal point, as a sign of welcome to the house.
 - 1. Taller shrubbery usually looks better on the corners of the house with lower ones under windows.
 - 2. Shrubbery in front of the windows should be kept trimmed below the level of the window.
- B. Consistency of design — the plan of border and edging of small plants and bulbs should be in harmony with foundation plantings.
- C. General Landscaping — foundation and design consistency combined. Pine straw should not be raked up around trees unless there are flowers or shrubs around the tree.
- D. Improvements
- E. Condition of Shrubbery
- F. Lawn
- G. Color

Only the front yard is judged. The yard is judged from the roadway, directly in front of the doorway. The homeowner must be current with association dues!

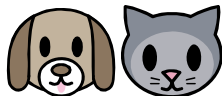
