Glenn and Butch addressed the responsibility of the police jury regarding the drainage in our subdivision. They also addressed the responsibility of the homeowner regarding driveways and culverts. The Parish will clean out ditches when notified. They were very informative and made a list of streets given by attendees needing attention. They also reminded the attendees the Parish will pick up appliances, limbs, etc. when called. If you have drainage issues, please take pictures when the water is an issue so that they can see exactly what is going on. It is hard to know where the issues are when things are so dry. They will also clean ditches out if they are not on private property and some culverts if they are stopped up but again—they must not be on private property.

Someone from the Public Service Commission will be attending the July 17th Board Meeting. Please be sure to attend to voice your concerns and get the latest information on the utility issues going on in our neighborhood.

Update on Bank Balance

The Chase bank balance as of the June Meeting was a little over \$64,000. Last year at that time it was a little over \$26,000. We had a budget of \$3,000 for Spring Fling but only spent \$2,360. As of the last Board Meeting there were 22 homeowners delinquent on their dues for over a year.

Please remember to keep up your yards! They are looking great! Yards will be judged for Yard of the Month so be sure to get those flowers planted and keep the grass cut! Flowers are blooming everywhere and add such beauty to the subdivision. Let's continue to make our neighborhood a beautiful place to live.

Yard of The Month Guidelines

- A. Foundation — placement of shrubbery.
- B. Plants and shrubs at the end of the walkway or beside the front door should be kept trimmed so that they do not obstruct the view of the front door. The front door should be the focal point, as a sign of welcome to the house.
 - 1. Taller shrubbery usually looks better on the corners of the house with lower ones under windows.
 - 2. Shrubbery in front of the windows should be kept trimmed below the level of the window.
- B. Consistency of design — the plan of border and edging of small plants and bulbs should be in harmony with foundation plantings.
- C. General Landscaping — foundation and design consistency combined. Pine straw should not be raked up around trees unless there are flowers or shrubs around the tree.
- D. Improvements
- E. Condition of Shrubbery
- F. Lawn
- G. Color

Only the front yard is judged. The yard is judged from the roadway, directly in front of the doorway. The homeowner must be current with association dues!

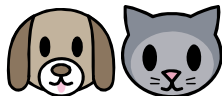
