Lately, it seems that there are Scammers everywhere you look. They will send emails, they will call you, they attack social media users such as Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, etc. I found a few links that may help you out. Most of these are updated as necessary. I would list the most common Scams but there are far too many to do that so I'm listing the links for your convenience and hope this helps.

A few tips to remember are:

Don't answer your phone if you don't recognize the number. If it is important, they will leave a message and you can return the call.

If you get a "one ring call" and then they hang up, **DO NOT call the number back.**

If someone calls stating that they are from your bank or credit card company, or even the Social Security office, **DO NOT PROVIDE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION TO THEM!** These places will NOT CALL YOU. Generally, you are the one to initiate those calls.

If you get a call or email stating you won a prize but need to pay taxes or other fees and they need you to provide a credit card or other form of payment, **DO NOT DO THAT!** Hang up or delete the email, whichever is the case.

One last tip is to always check the email address before clicking on ANY LINK in an email. Many companies pretend to be someone they aren't. For example, it may say it is from Amazon but the email link looks something like this:

amazonsupport@lksdfjjssdf3421.com This is not a legitimate email address! I get about 8 of these emails weekly. They always have links and are always trying to SCAM you this way!

Homemade Kentucky Blackberry Cobbler

2 1/2 c blackberries, washed (Can also use blueberries if you like)

1 c sugar

1 c flour

2 t baking powder

1/2 t salt

1 c milk

1/2 c unsalted butter, melted

- Preheat oven to 375
- Stir together just the berries and sugar in a large bowl and let it sit out for 25-30 minutes.
- Stir together the flour, baking powder, salt, and milk with a wooden spoon.
- Next, stir in the melted butter and hand-mix it until the ingredients are well incorporated and you have few clumps.
- Pour batter into medium baking dish and smooth it out.
- You can choose to line it with parchment paper or not, but don't grease the pan.
- Finally, pour the macerated blackberries on top with all the sugar included and evenly distribute it over the batter.
- Bake for 45 minutes to an hour, depending on how golden you prefer it to be.
- Let it cool for 15 minutes so it will hold its shape.
