Here are a few recipes that are great for holiday parties!

PECANS

Cook pecans @ 300 degrees until brown and crunchy - between 20 and 30 minutes. (Test them occasionally for desired crunchiness)

Coat pecans with butter while hot

Season as desired with salt

Stir and drain on paper towels.

COATED PEANUTS

2 cups raw, shelled peanuts

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup water

Few drops red food coloring

Cook on medium heat until all liquid is boiled out and peanuts are not sticking together.

Pour on foil covered cookie sheet and bake for about 30 minutes @ 250 degrees. (May be more or less time, depending on your oven)

TEXAS CAVIAR

1 can black-eye peas, drained and rinsed

1 can black beans, drained and rinsed

1 can shoe peg corn

1 can Rotel

8 oz. (1 cup) Italian Dressing

4 green onions, chopped

3 slices of purple onion, chopped

1 lime

Squeeze the lime and add the juice to a container. Add all other ingredients and mix.

Best to make this a day in advance.

CHEESE SPREAD

1 lb. Velveeta cheese

3 oz. Cream cheese

1 teasp. lemon juice

1 clove garlic or 1/2 teasp. garlic powder

3/4 cups chopped nuts

Mix together well, sprinkle chili powder on wax paper. Make cheese mixture into rolls and roll in chili powder. Roll each roll in wax paper and keep refrigerated.

When serving, cut thin slices and place on Ritz crackers.

Unfortunately, with the holidays come thieves. Here are a few tips you can follow to hopefully help keep theft down to a minimum.

- Leave some lights on, both inside and outside, especially when gone. Timers are inexpensive and you can set them to go on and off while you are gone. This gives the appearance of someone being home.
- Keep valuables out of sight in your car. Don't tempt thieves with nice items in plain view.
- Be vigilant about locking up. That means your home and vehicles. Many thieves can be deterred by having locked doors. Unlocked doors make their jobs easy.
- Ask your neighbors to keep an eye on things for you while you are gone.
- Many companies offer delivery manager to schedule when deliveries are made or where they leave packages. Check into that for online shopping. These offer that service: UPS, FedEx, Amazon has something called Amazon Locker. All worth checking into for the holidays and any other time, as well.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Stay off cell phones when walking to your car, in parking lots, etc.
